Huntington, NY (March 7<sup>th</sup>, 2011) The High Arts Showcase VII will be held from April 7<sup>th</sup> – May 2<sup>nd</sup>. The Huntington Arts Council is showcasing work involving all media from top high school artists who participated in our Journey Program. The opening will be held on April 7<sup>th</sup>, 2011 at the Art-trium Gallery located at 24 Melville Park Rd., Melville, NY 11747 from 5:30 – 7:30 pm.

Participating high schools include: Commack, Harborfields, Huntington, North Babylon, Northport, POB John F. Kennedy and Walt Whitman. Music will be performed by Commack, North Babylon and Huntington students.

The high caliber of the work is tribute not just to the students, but also to the extensive art programs and talented faculty at these schools. The high schools have selected pieces of art and sculpture from their 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students.

Founded in 1963, the Huntington Arts Council is a not-for-profit organization which enriches the quality of life of Long Islanders with programs and services that address the needs and interests of artists, cultural organizations and the community.
