- Selected works are chosen by the juror. No more than two works per artist are selected.

ELIGIBILITY

- All artists and media.

SIZE

- No work should exceed 48 inches in any direction.
- Standing work cannot be higher than 72 inches.
- Video maximum: 50 MB.

ENTRY FEE

- First three entries:

 Full-time students \$25
 Additional entries \$5 each
 Please note: **Entry fees are nonrefundable.**

- Works are insured while in the possession of the Huntington Arts Council.
