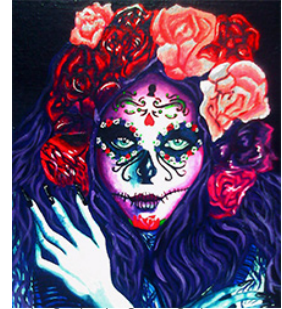

ENTRIES

- Entries must be original to entrant. Framed entries require hanging wire. Submission materials cannot be returned.
- Selected works are chosen by the juror. No more than two works per artist are selected.

ELIGIBILITY

- All student artists grades 6-12, all media

SIZE

- No work should exceed 48 inches in any direction.
- Standing work cannot be higher than 72 inches.
- Video maximum: 50 MB.

HOW TO ENTER

1. Submit application and payment at www.huntingtonarts.org (preferred method).
2. Download paper application from website. Mail or drop off with CD images and payment.
Note: Images must be 300 dpi, 2400 pixels on the longest side.
