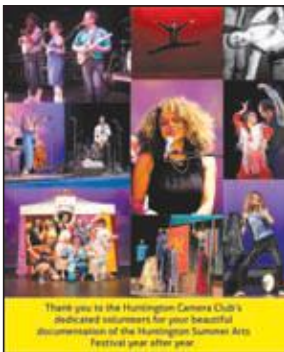

Long Island Grants for the Arts

The Huntington Arts Council administers the Statewide Community Re-grant (SCR) Program (previously known as DEC) to make funding possible for individuals, teaching artists, and nonprofit organizations looking to do arts and cultural projects. The grants are made possible with funds from the State & Local Partnerships (SLP) program of NYSCLA and with the support of the Office of the Governor and the NYS Legislature.

There are three SCR grant categories. Creative Communities, which support nonprofit organizations for arts and cultural programming in local and surrounding communities, Creative Learning supporting teaching artists to complete sequential programming for K-12 students or lifelong learners, and Creative Individuals for artists who wish to complete a new arts project.

There are some changes for the 2023 grant application process. HAC provided grant Skill Building Sessions as a resource for our applicants. These NEW Skill Building Sessions took place in August with a wonderful response from our constituents. These sessions were tailored to SCR grant opportunities, covering important points within the application(s) such as learning how to connect your art form to the New York State Art Standards, an introduction to the NEW budget worksheet, and strategies for community outreach and marketing. These sessions have already concluded, but video recordings are available on our website at www.huntingtonarts.org.

In order to be eligible for a 2023 SCR Grant, you must attend one of the mandatory seminars (previously known as workshops). These began in September, and run through October 13th. There are three remaining. The format has changed from previous years, and the seminars are specific to each grant category. You must register in advance at the grants for the arts page on our website www.huntingtonarts.org. The remaining seminars are as follows:

- Creative Individual – Oct 6, 2022 2pm Virtual
- Creative Communities – Oct 11, 2022 6pm Virtual
- LAST CALL – Overview of SCR grant opportunities and Q&A – Oct 13, 2022 4:30 – 5:30 pm Spotlight at the Paramount, 370 New York Ave, Huntington NY

Upon conclusion of the seminars, grant applications can be accessed on our website beginning October 17th. The deadline to submit completed applications is 3:00PM on December 5th 2022.

Arts in Education JOURNEY

Established in 1985, JOURNEY is a multi-component arts in education program available to school districts providing resources for learning about world cultures through arts and arts experiences. JOURNEY integrates cultural arts into classroom curriculum encouraging an individualized experience and appreciation of cultural diversity through the arts.

CTLE CULTURAL ARTS WORKSHOPS

Staff development opportunities for teachers using arts as the starting point to learn about the history, traditions, social systems, and economics of a culture. Led by indigenous artists, scholars and educators. See below for offerings this fall.

DISCOVERY LENDING CHESTS

Consisting of cultural artifacts, lessons, books, artworks, musical instruments and other tools, the chests bring hands on cultural experiences to students. The cultures available are: Ancient Egypt, Africa, China, Greece, India, Latin

America, Middle East and Native America. Russia and Japanese Tea Ceremony mini chests are also available for loan.

VISITING ARTISTS

Visiting teaching artists from a variety of cultures and artistic genres are available for workshops, residencies and assemblies in the schools. A directory of artists is available.

HIGH ARTS SHOWCASE

JOURNEY partner high school students are chosen by their teachers to participate in a visual art exhibition or a performing arts event in collaboration with the Huntington Arts Council. These opportunities enable students to gain experience in presenting/promoting their talents, and interaction with the arts community.

2022-2023 participating school districts: Cold Spring Harbor CSD, Commack UFSD, Harborfields CSD, Huntington UFSD, Kings Park CSD, Northport-East Northport UFSD, Plainview-Old Bethpage Central School District and South Huntington UFSD.

Fall CTLE Cultural Arts Workshops

JOURNEY offers 5 CTLE Cultural Arts Workshops for teacher professional development. As a sponsor for Continuing Teacher and Leader Education teachers attending these workshops receive a certificate of completion with approved CTLE hours. The workshops are FREE to JOURNEY participating districts. Teachers

outside of JOURNEY can participate for a small fee.

Local Indigenous History and Wampum Carving

Culturally responsive teaching artist Tecumseh Ceaser is a Wampum Carver and Cultural Consultant: Long Island Native American Graves Protection group and an Advisor for the Global Indigenous Youth Caucus at the United Nations. His presentation on local Native history, culture, customs, and wampum, is often excluded from textbooks. Using tactile examples and the indigenous language, Ceaser will teach his Native history as a living history, as taught by his Elders. New York City and the tri state area has one of the largest Native populations and active tribes. Every day we use or see Native words and don't realize it, like Rockaways, Canarsie, Montauk, Shinnecock and more. Students in grades 4-8 will be able to see the influence that Native culture has on their communities and American society. 3 CTLE Hours (Civics and Cultural Responsiveness)

Textile and Teaching Artist Oksana Danziger will discuss the principle of eco printing with various leaves and plant materials which possess tannins that have the innate ability to print permanent color onto fabric fibers when combined with the proper technique and procedure. Eco printing is directly related to the art of dyeing with natural plant materials and has been around since 100 A.D. Sustainable art forms have become very popular and designing in sustainable ways will impact the entire world. We can make the process experimental and creative using natural sources of dye. At this workshop we will make a scarf using an eco-print of leaves and flowers. 3 CTLE Hours (STEAM: Cultural, Sustainability and EnvironmentalStudies)

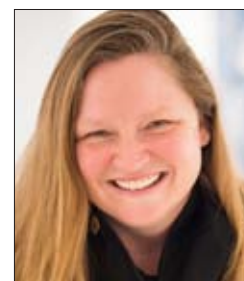

By integrating self-regulation & self-awareness, we can help our children and students reduce stress, alleviate anxiety/depression while promoting improved self-esteem, and creativity. Strong academic skills, social-emotional learning, and mindfulness are vital for our children and students to thrive individually and collectively in our ever changing world. 3 CTLE Hours (Social emotional learning, self-awareness and self-management)

Author, poet, educator and cultural events coordinator Adriana Devers will discuss Sandra Cisneros, "La casa en Mango Street" and how it presents a variety of topics on social issues that we face in today's society. Literature is meant to empower, connect, and build a bridge that allows the readers to see themselves through the story at hand. "Mango Street" tells a story that many of us can connect to, it teaches our students the value of their own stories and the impact that our heritage has on us. This workshop addresses the main themes presented in the novel, with useful student centered activities, writing assignments and tools that will add more value to your lesson or make you want to add it to your repertoire. 3 CTLE Hours (Communication, Cultures, Connections, Comparisons, Communities, creating, producing, responding, collaboration, critical thinking and creativity)

Looking at Art and Making Meaning
Huntington Arts Council

Director, Hillwood Art Museum at Long Island University, Professor Barbara Applegate will discuss how many images do you view each day? How about in text messages? Or social media? How many of those images do you REALLY look at or consider deeply? Not all images require careful looking, but some do. In this workshop we will develop skill sets for the practice of careful looking. This workshop is an introduction to Visual Thinking Strategies. In principle and practice VTS promotes thoughtfully facilitated discussions of art to make education more engaging, inclusive, and equitable. These skills can be used with your students to promote careful looking, invigorate guided discussion, and increase students' visual focus. 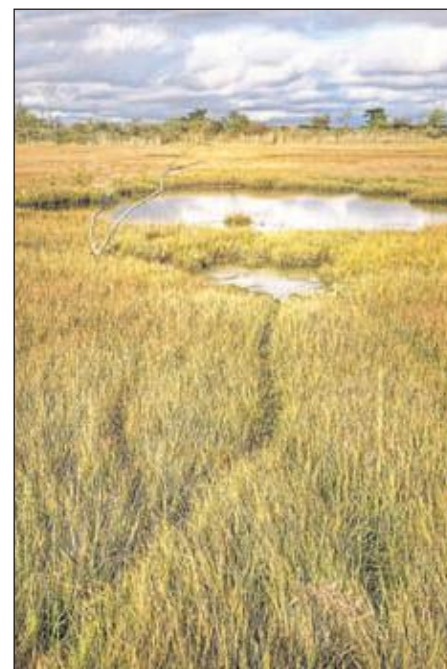
Nightmare on Main St.

Student artists grades 6 -12 were invited to submit work to Nightmare on Main Street, inspired by this statement by Juror, Lauren La Bella. *During the Bubonic Plague, the Plague Doctor became a memento mori, a symbol for one's last earthly moments, as this was usually the last thing a person would see before meeting their death. The long beak of the mask was filled with herbs and spices that were believed to filter out the "bad spirit", protecting the wearer from those he was visiting; the long, waxy coat and hat protecting their skin and clothes underneath. A long staff was used to make contact with the bodies without having to touch them directly. This ominous uniform, once functional and commonplace, became a masquerade costume for those celebrating the Venetian Carnival, a time where one could conceal their identity while partying and living freely for a short time, once a year. This frightening yet beautiful disguise was just one of the many characters to choose from. Similarly, Halloween is a once-a-year opportunity to disguise yourself or be unknown, and to celebrate the darker parts of life. In the medium of your choice, show us how you interpret these concepts.*

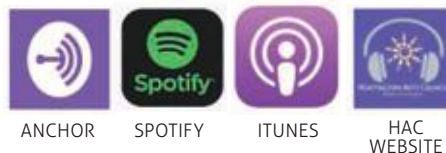
