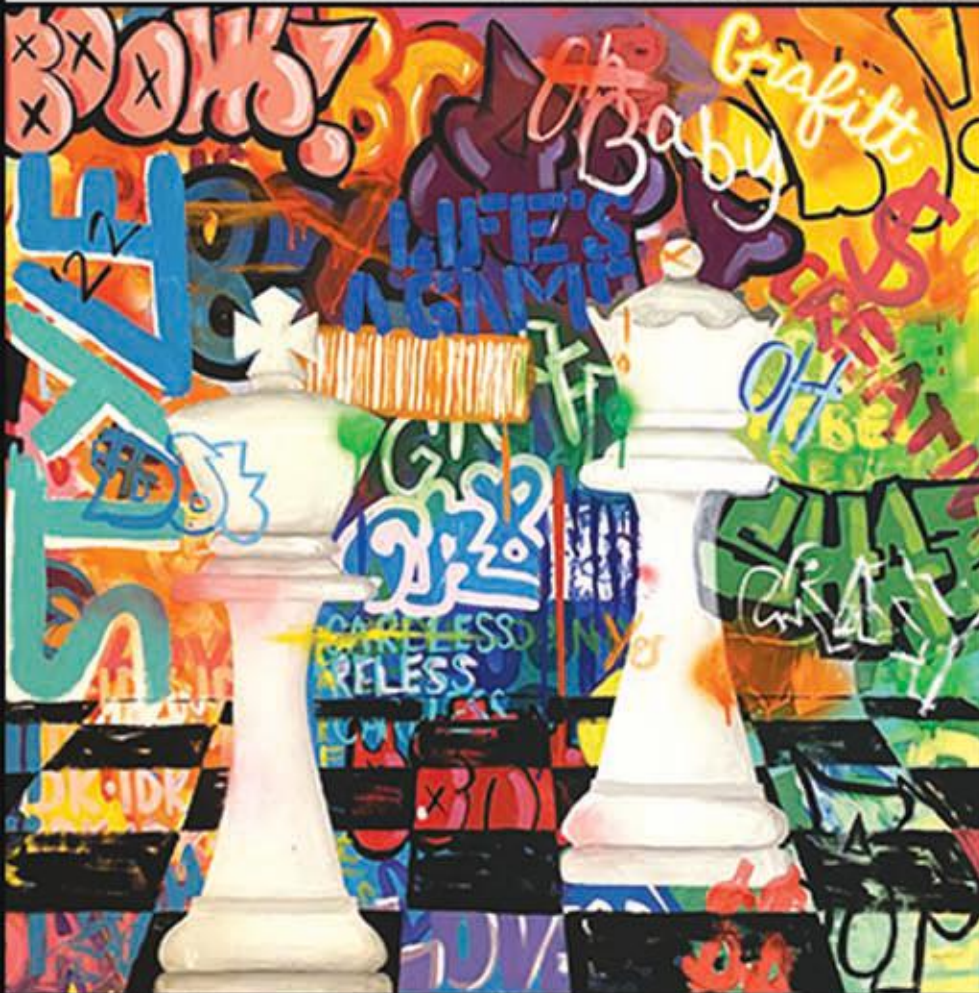

I write my last letter as Executive Director of Huntington Arts Council before my retirement at the end of February, and take pride in leaving the organization healthy and moving forward. I trust my Board of Directors to find the best candidate to take over leadership and continue to evolve the organization. The pandemic has taught us that the arts

are not only a vital part of our lives and community, but an integral part of our area economy.

As I leave, HAC's programming is robust, and we are offering a variety of exhibits, events and services to our arts community. Our gallery hosts the juried show *Bold Movements*, followed by the essential *High Arts Showcase*, featuring an exhibit showcasing the best of the 8 school districts in our JOURNEY program, as well as an evening focusing on the fine performing artists they produce. The small group show will feature three of our artist members, Paul Mele, Toxic/Nature Studios, and Khurshid Saleem, and will be the featured show during the spring art walk on May 22. *Conversations in the Arts* continues monthly through May, and *Arts Leadership Forums* in collaboration with LI Arts Alliance are planned for February and May. HAC is hosting the NYSCA/ NYFA Artist as Entrepreneur program to offer artists technical assistance with

business practices. Grants for the Arts will present awards totaling \$310,500 to area artists and organizations to maintain programming throughout Long Island. I offer congratulations to John Coraor in recognition of his services to the arts community as he receives the Harry and Sandy Chapin Arts and Humanitarian Award at HAC's Benefit on May 19, and am honored to receive a Harry and Sandy Chapin Legacy Award on May 19 alongside my excellent colleagues Kay Sato and Beth Levinthal.

I leave offering my best wishes, and look forward to returning to HAC and enjoying its many fine artistic offerings. It has been a great experience serving as HAC leader for seven years!

Tributes to Friends of HAC



Ken Butterfield passed away on November 14, 2021. His dedication to Huntington ranged from being the first full time Town Attorney to filling the office of Supervisor. In addition to his pioneering work on behalf of the town, HAC had the

pleasure of knowing Ken for his music. A lifelong musician, he played trumpet in the U.S. Military Academy Band at West Point. He enjoyed playing with his Dixieland jazz band, the Isotope Stompers, across Long Island for decades. Ken oversaw the construction of the Harry Chapin Rainbow Stage and was first to play there upon its completion. Ken playing trumpet at the Summer Arts Festival is reflected in this painting that hangs our office.



Rodee Hansen passed away in November of 2021. Born in Germany, she later became a U.S. citizen. Rodee had a love of the arts, especially opera, the ballet, and visual art, becoming an accomplished painter in her own right. She was a longtime member of HAC and participated in many of our exhibitions. We have fond memories of Rodee and enjoyed seeing her at our artist receptions. She will be missed.



Joseph T. Beck, an English teacher at Plainview-Old Bethpage John F. Kennedy High School (POBJFK) for over 20 years passed away suddenly in December. POBJFK is a long standing JOURNEY Program partner school. Joe was also the Drama Director, co-advisor to the school newspaper and editor for the Yearbook. He was a well-respected author and playwright, and happiest when he was telling a story. Joe's family had requested that in lieu of flowers donations could be made to HAC in memory of Joe. family and extend our sincere condolences to them.

Donations to our Cultural Affairs Institute have continued to fund new installations of Traffic Signal Box Art created by local and regional artists to beautify Huntington infrastructure. These donations have allowed us to make improvements at Heckscher Park with holiday light installations and a new digital audio console for the Chapin Rainbow Stage to enhance the sounds of our summer concert series organized by the Huntington Arts Council (www.huntingtonarts.org).

2022 Statewide Community Regrant Program

The Huntington Arts Council had a successful year with the Statewide Community Regrant (SCR) Program! We had a total of 83 applicants across all categories: Creative Communities, Learning, and Individual as well as Capacity Building. Funding

has been allocated to 68 of those applicants. Congratulations to all of the recipients. We cannot wait to see your inspiring projects come to fruition!

Restart NY

Additionally, NYSCA offered the opportunity to “restart” live performances across the state with the new Restart NY grant opportunity. Two categories were made available for applicants. Round one which increased the awards from the 2021 Decentralization cycle for existing scheduled programming, and round two offered grant awards ranging

from \$1000-\$3000 for organizations or individuals for in person (live) arts events.

Panel reviews and subsequent recommendations for both SCR and Restart took place in October. Contracts have been issued to those awardees whose projects have been accepted for the 2022 cycle.

NYSCA Individual Artist Grants

Huntington Arts Council is pleased to announce that two of our members have received NYSCA Individual Artist Grants of \$10,000 each.

2022 Huntington Summer Arts Festival Preview

Planning for the 2022 Huntington Summer Arts Festival is in full swing and we look forward to presenting a new cornucopia of music, dance and entertainment with an exciting roster of artists & ensembles and musical genres. A highlight will be the return of LIVE Family Concerts on Tuesday evenings after a two year absence. Sonia De Los Santos, Lucy Kalantari & The Jazz Cats, and Brady Rimer, are all expected to perform for our live audiences.

Marking its 57th edition, the Festival will highlight both established artists and emerging talent, from L.I. & NY Metro, as well as touring artists from across the U.S. and around the globe. The Huntington Summer

Arts Festival will feature a wide variety and breadth of programming, including Jazz, Americana/Folk & Roots, Classical & Crossover, Pop/Rock, World Music, Dance and Musical Theatre. Wednesday through Sunday concerts at the Chapin Rainbow Stage in Heckscher Park will begin at 8:00 PM. Audiences should be on the lookout for pre-concert ensembles prior to Huntington Community Band performances and fascinating on-stage interviews with visiting artists. The Northport Community Band will perform five consecutive concerts on Thursday evenings' beginning at 8:30 PM at the Robert F. Krueger Band Shell in Northport Harbor.

Thematically, 2022 HSAF will feature a week-long focus on Women in Jazz, and explorations by Americana, Folk & World Music Artists into music's magical ability to communicate. A number of touring artists are back on the roster: Cyrille Aimee, French Dominican jazz vocalist extraordinaire; rollicking Celtic band The High Kings from Ireland; Canadian born trumpeter and vocalist Bria Skonberg; and the astonishing Jazz saxophonist Lakecia Benjamin and Pursuance, with her profound exploration into the music of John & Alice Coltrane.

Local and regional ensembles that have long formed the backbone of the Festival, in addition to the Huntington and Northport Community Bands, include Huntington Men's Chorus, the L.I. Dance Consortium, Plaza Theatrical Productions, Nassau Pops Symphony Orchestra, plus a few surprises.

Arts in Education JOURNEY

The goal of the district wide arts in education JOURNEY program is to promote cultural diversity through the arts. JOURNEY is comprised of multiple components; CTLE Cultural Arts Workshops, Discovery Chests, Visiting Artists and High Arts Showcase. Participating school districts for 2021-2022 include: Cold Spring Harbor CSD, Commack UFSD, Harborfields CSD, Huntington UFSD, Kings Park CSD, Northport-East Northport UFSD, Plainview-Old Bethpage CSD and South Huntington UFSD.

CTLE CULTURAL ARTS WORKSHOPS Professional Development for Teachers

The CTLE workshop series for the 21-22 school year concluded on 11/15/21. 6 cultural arts workshops were offered in dance, music, fine arts, and literature. Participants received a CTLE certificate

for each 3 hour workshop. A total of 381 CTLE hours were awarded including 300 hours granted to teachers to meet their Language Acquisition requirement through the NYSDE. HAC is a sponsor for New York State Department of Education and able to provide Continuing Teaching and Learning Education hours as required for teaching certificate holders in New York State. Each of our JOURNEY partner school districts had teachers attend at least one workshop for a total of 124 attendees.

DISCOVERY CHESTS Cultural Artifact Loans for Classroom Learning

This school year 53 Discovery Chests have been used in the classrooms of JOURNEY partner schools. The Latin America and Native American chests were borrowed for Hispanic Heritage and

Native American Heritage months. The donation of additional Native American artifacts from Sandy Chapin, founder and chairperson of JOURNEY enabled two additional chests to be developed.

With over 30 Discovery Chests available, representing 10 different world cultures, we encourage partner and non-partner schools to take advantage of these chests as much as possible. For more information on the JOURNEY program email artsined@huntingtonarts.org

Dance Scholarships

The Rea Jacobs Scholarship for Dance is a competitive scholarship for Nassau & Suffolk High School graduating seniors who are pursuing a four year college degree with a major or minor in dance. The \$1,000 scholarship is funded by the Long Island Dance Consortium and the Jacobs Family.

The winners of both dance scholarships will be invited to perform separately with member companies of the Long Island Dance Consortium at the Huntington Summer Arts Festival in the summer of 2022.

The dance scholarship applications are due Monday, May 2, 2022. Winners will be notified by May 31, 2022.

Visual Arts Scholarship

The Joan Aboff Memorial Art Scholarship is a competitive visual arts scholarship for 10th and 11th grade students residing in the town of Huntington. The scholarship is to *Usdan; Summer Camp for the Arts* for the 4 Week Session B and will be specifically for the Portfolio Development class. It is a value

of \$4600. The scholarship is funded by the Aboff family. The application is due February 22, 2022. Winners will be notified by March 8, 2022.

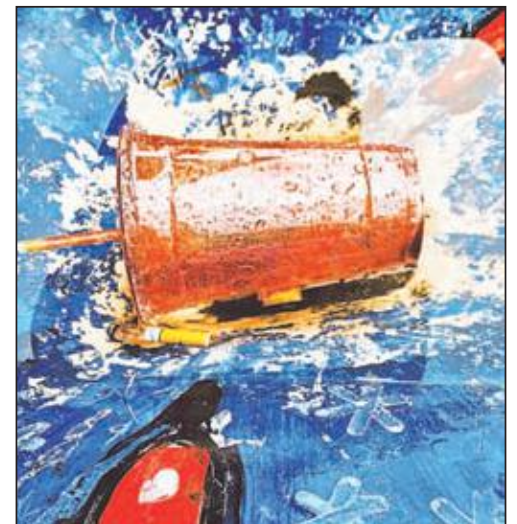

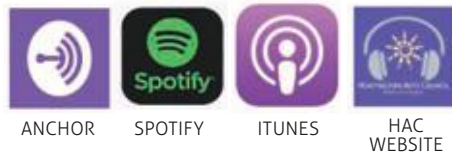

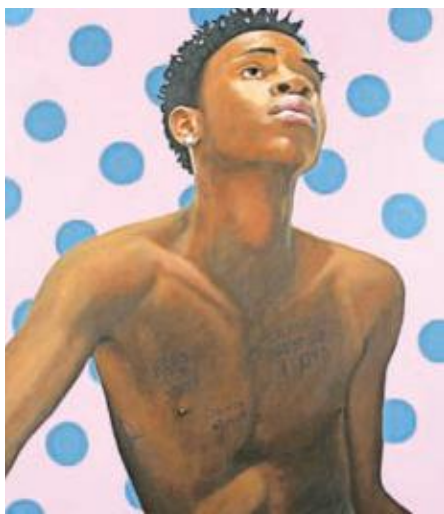
