I didn't grow up in what many would consider a creative household. My pops was a union guy at the phone company. My mom was a career secretary. But that wasn't all as they worked many jobs to give me and my siblings everything they could. One thing they always instilled in us was an appreciation for the arts and everything creative around us.

Now, being a parent, I see how invaluable that suggested donation was to the Met, to walk around the public art that's in Central Park, spend time at the local library, or even see free live performances at the Forrest Park Bandshell. These all provided free access to the arts. Our access point was via the J, A or E train which always had prominently displayed an ad for the School of Visual Arts, "Art is_____"

Funny how now, it's my job to contemplate that old adage almost every single day. I think if you asked me each day, I would give you a different answer. But the answer I'll keep coming back to is "Art is home." That's why access to the arts is so important. The arts give us a sense of place, with sense of community, and a sense of belonging. Art makes us feel at home.

I won't bore you with citations here, *come by the gallery for that*, but there is psychology and data to back this up. Access to the arts and public art decreases littering/pollution and reduces crime. At the same time it increases people's sense of ownership in their neighborhood while increasing a neighborhood's livability and boosts the local economy.

The arts will never be on the same level as humanitarian efforts. Art doesn't provide shelter from the elements. Art isn't a survival instinct of "Don't jump off a cliff" and "Don't eat bark." What art does is make that shelter home, it turns the cliff into a vista, and turns that bark into paper pulp to adorn.

Living in Huntington Township we are fortunate to live in a center point in the creative sector of Long Island. Let's make sure to keep fostering these endeavors to ensure that in our home "Art is Everywhere."

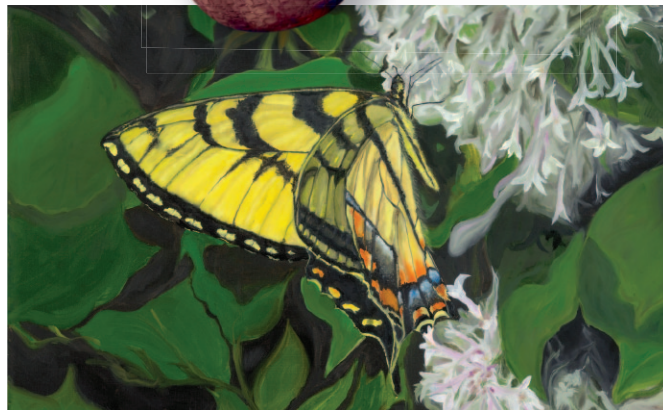
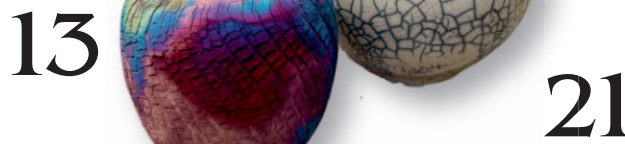

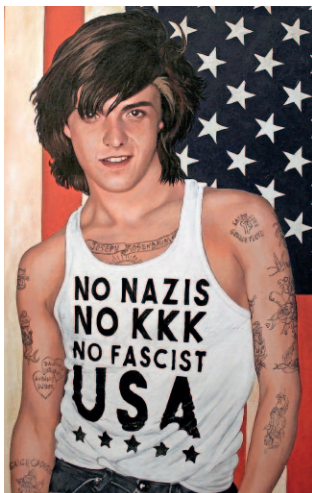

The stage was set for a fantastic season of FREE, live performances opening weekend at the Chapin Rainbow stage in Heckscher Park with the raucous fusion of bhangra, hip-hop, jazz, and energy of Sunny Jain's *Red Baraat*. Fans turned out in full force, ready to dance and celebrate.

Six-time Grammy® winning Arturo O'Farrill and the Afro Latin Jazz Orchestra thrilled with their world-class musicianship. O'Farrill's gracious remarks about his

delight in playing the Chapin Rainbow Stage – "...it's a real groove..." were especially welcome.

Festival mainstays were back with weekly performances by **The Huntington Community Band** celebrating their 78th season and **The Northport Community Band's** 66th season.

Established in 1985, by Chairperson, Sandy Chapin JOURNEY is a multi-component arts in education program available to school districts providing resources for learning about world cultures through arts and arts experiences. JOURNEY integrates cultural arts into classroom curriculum encouraging an individualized experience and appreciation of cultural diversity through the arts.

Discovery Lending Chests

These chests bring hands on cultural experiences to students. They consist of cultural artifacts, lessons, books, artworks, musical instruments and other tools. Current cultures available for loan: Ancient Egypt, Africa, China, Greece, India, Latin America, Middle East and Native America. We also have "mini" chests available for loan which include just artifacts and description cards. These chests are Russia and Japanese Tea Ceremony.



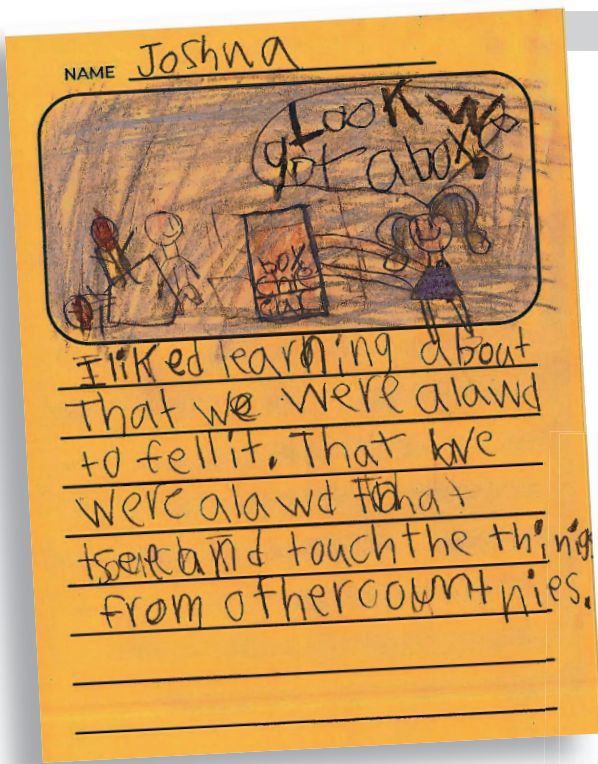

Long Island Grants for the Arts

The Huntington Arts Council is proud to administer the New York State Council on the Arts (NYSCA) Statewide Community Regrant (SCR) program with 6 grant opportunities, five annual and one bi-monthly. SCR grants support individual artists, collectives, and small nonprofit organizations in developing high quality local arts projects and programming providing opportunities for the public to experience and engage with the arts.

SCR Annual Grants awarded at \$2500 and \$5000 are: Creative Communities, Creative Learning: In School and After School/Community Centers, Creative Individual and Capacity Building (invitation only). The 2024 grants cycle is well underway with applications submitted by October 23, 2023.

2023 Creative Communities Grant Awardee Spotlights

The Word - A Festival of the Spoken and Written Word: Celebrating all Voices is a project by Paula Curci, broadcaster, school counseling educator, and recently named Poet Laureate of Nassau County.

The mission of The Word was to celebrate, inspire, and entertain, bringing together established and fledgling poets, artists, performers, and educators with everyone who loves to read, write, and create. It was a pan-generational, multi-cultural full day of rejoicing in the glow of our Long Island talent, proudly done in Oceanside, NY. The festival featured multiple stages where folks could listen to and participate in presentations, mini writing workshops/meet-ups, read in an open mic or watch an art demo.

Pronto of Long Island, a nonprofit community outreach center providing services to families and youth on Long Island received a grant for their program, *Family Nourishment*. Students were given a unique opportunity to artistically connect with their families and share stories with the community by creating short film documentaries over the course of the program. Artists Dan Kudreyko, Swati Srivastava, Anne Beyrer, and Sam Parmely, helped guide the students. The culmination was two public gallery exhibits at Teatro Yerbabruja and Pronto with over 1,500 people seeing the work. Students were selected as community artist leaders to use their voices for inspiration while simultaneously gaining skill in editing film, creating multi-media content, and crafting a compelling story.



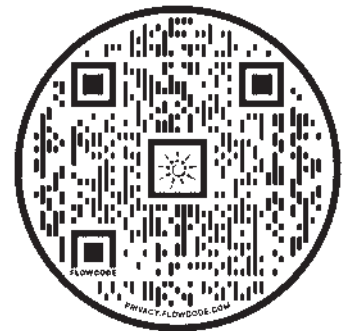

South Shore is a short narrative film by grant recipient Kevin Lopez producer, documentary filmmaker and a leader in film and media arts education. *South Shore* captures a pivotal moment in the story arc of a reclusive, live-aboard sailor who comes face to face with the young immigrant man whom he suspects may have killed his son. The script is adapted from “*The Secret Sharer*,” by Joseph Conrad, and influenced by real events on the South Shore of Long Island, New York. Themes of leaving and belonging, suspicion and mutual aid are captured in a gripping face-to face confrontation with an unexpected outcome.

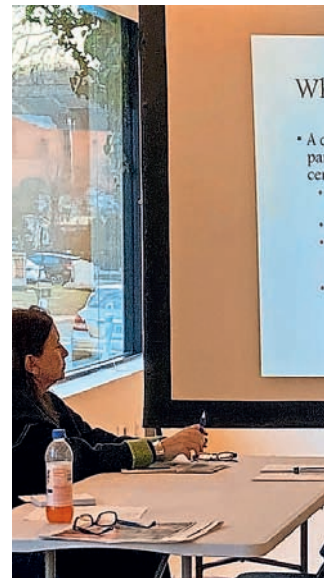

consultations with arts and entertainment attorneys to discuss a wide range of topics.

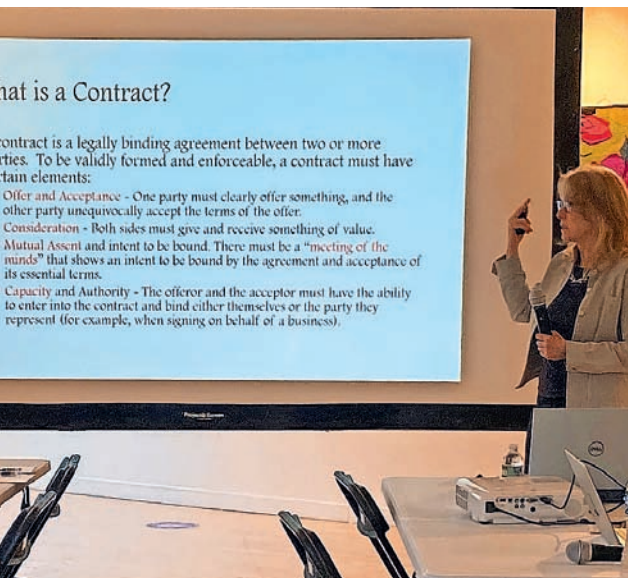

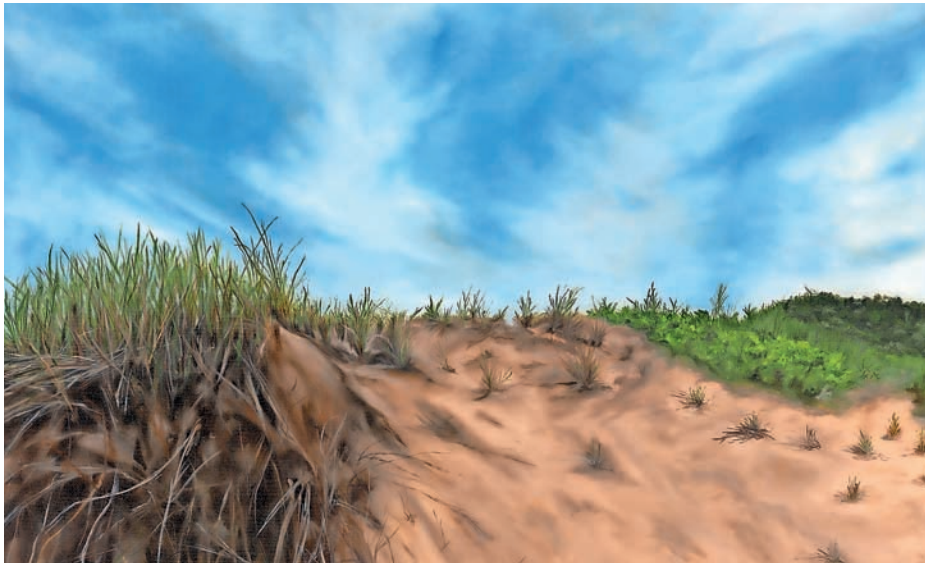

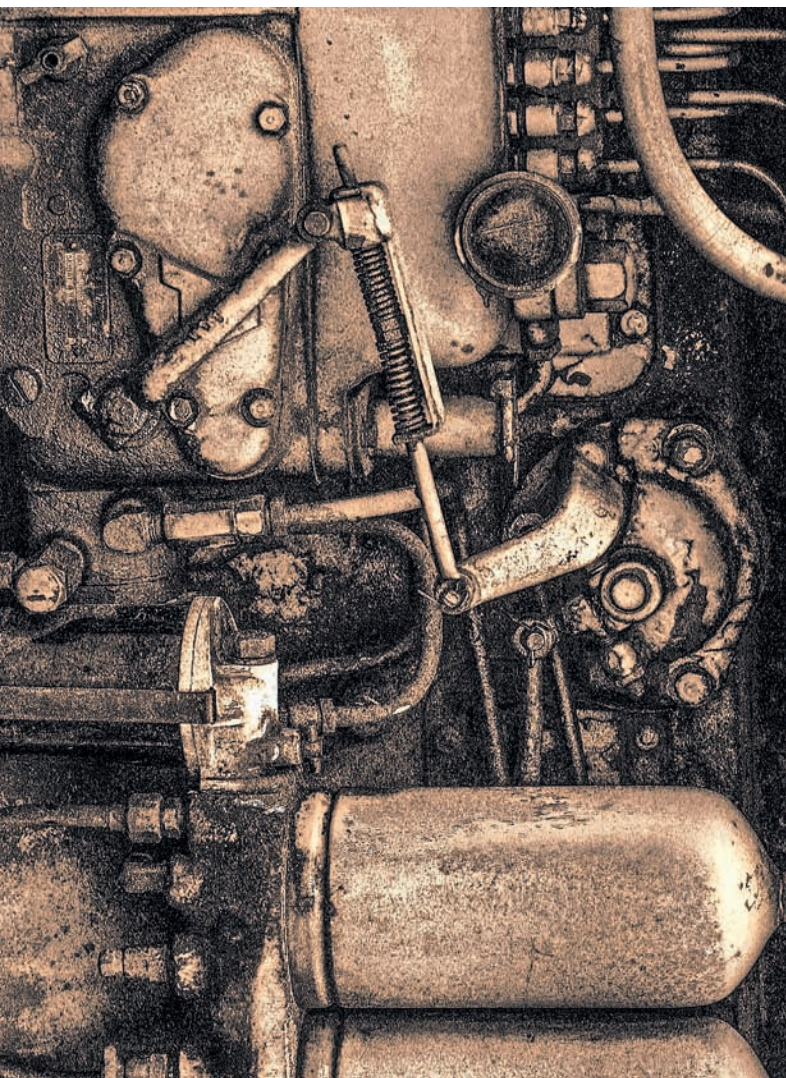

Tiny Collective

A Collective, by definition, is a group of entities that share or are motivated by at least one common issue or interest, or work together to achieve a common objective. In the case of Tiny Collective, those entities are people who share in the belief that art and creativity can aid in the growth of a fuller human being, and by extension, uplift and unify the wider community. Our names are Sage Cotignola, Jeffery Espinoza, Audreiana Lesty, and Christophe Lima. We work for Huntington Arts Council as Muralists and Art Educators. We are funded by Creatives Rebuild New York.

At this time in our country's history, accessibility to, and funding for the creative and expressive arts is dwindling at a time where we need it the most. Creatives Rebuild New York was created in 2021 to provide funding for the creative arts following the devastation left by the Covid-19 Pandemic. This funding has allowed the Tiny Collective to provide accessible public murals and Mural Education to the Long Island Community. Whereas CRNY has provided the financial support through its donors, Huntington Arts Council has provided the boots-on-the-ground support.

Through their pre-existing JOURNEY Program and new Professional Development Series, they have armed us with the tools for success, the freedom to express our individual voices, and utilize our strengths. Since our partnership began in February of 2023, the Tiny Collective has completed 4 public murals, and while we are waiting on approvals for 7 more inclusive projects, we continue to pursue more.

On a personal level, the reason(s) why we, Tiny Collective, do what we do, and why we are so passionate about the work, is simple. The creative and expressive arts have soothed our collective souls. Visual arts specifically has given our members a sense of agency when times were at their darkest. It's given us a voice, and aided in the navigation of our lives. The arts have allowed us to transmute our thoughts, experiences, trials and tribulations into murals and personal work that aims to connect with others in a meaningful and lasting way. We have on our team those who have gone through a classical arts education, and those who are self-taught, not having access to the arts as a younger person. The discovery of this type of creativity gave those members fuel for the education of our community's youth.

It is important to express that our small team of 4 would not be able to do any of this work without the support of CRNY, HAC, and each other. It is easy when you are an artist to become befuddled by anxiety and fear; to be derailed by burnout. By all of these entities working together we are able to lift each other up and do meaningful, impactful, community work.

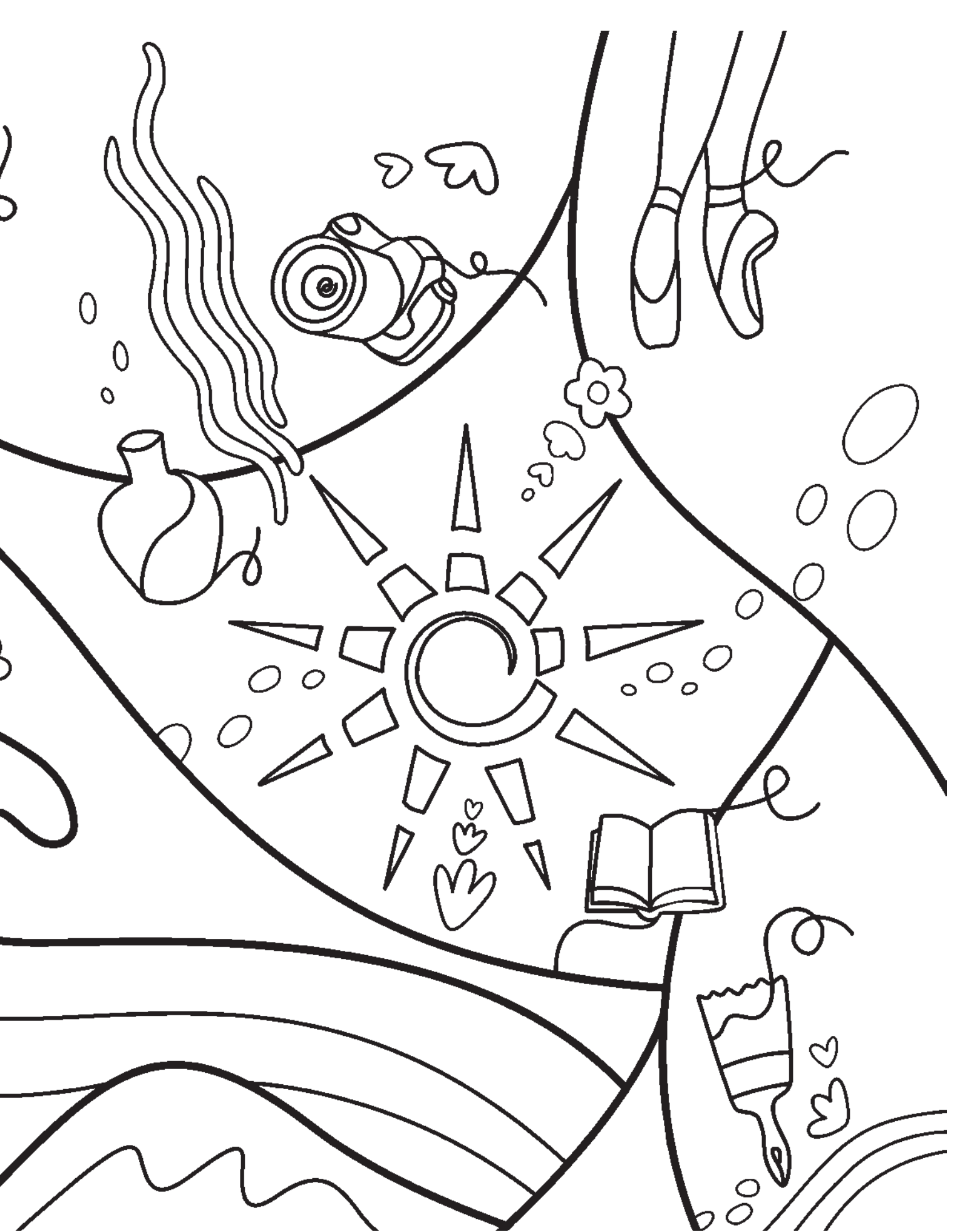

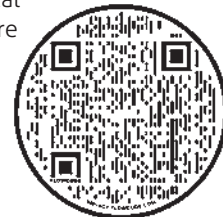

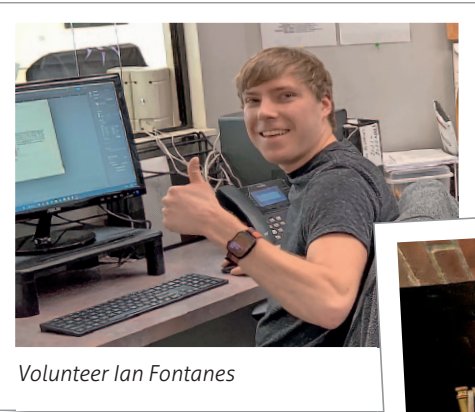
